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

## WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME, BAROLI AHIR, AGRA

Women empowerment program aims at addressing Gender specific issues in the community at rural level. Often it is noted that women tend to develop an inferior complex if they are deprived of spaces to express themselves. Considering women as the equally potential donor to the society we fashion scope for women to participate in public undertakings in the villages and encourage and guidance for informed decision making. Activities with women are designed to enhance their confidence and self-esteem. In the course of time we see women emerge leading communities and fighting against exploitation at various level. The women empowered raise voice against the rights of the mighty and facilitate collective actions to serve justice. We deliberately stand behind the women energy and escort their networks with government and other public serving entities to access entitlements for all deserving members in the community. In this journey of empowerment our stakeholders are mentored and capacitated with various skills so that they would control and own the journey as they move ahead.

**SUCCESS STORY - 1**



I am Neha Devi from Lodhai village from Baroli Ahir Block. I belong to Jai Kaila Ma SHG and I joined the group one year back which was already running well. I attended some of trainings that changed my life. I started getting lot of information of various topics and issues. I was encouraged and empowered as ACDSSS gave training on various IGPs and the skills to increase income through small IGPs. with the support of my husband I started a

candle making unit. I took Rs. 7000 loan from the group and bought different size of candle moulds for Rs 1,000 from Delhi and started making candles, plain as well as colourful. we are selling it in shop as well in mela. Now my husband and all family members are happy because we gain good income from this initiative.



**SUCCESS STORY - 2**

I am Mrs. Saroj wife of Babloo from Devori. My husband earns a meagre income from a shoe factory. We found it very difficult to run the house with the income of my husband. I had joined Krishna SHG 2 years back started by ACDSSS. We were going through a tough life after my husband lost his job due to GST related lay off. I discussed with my husband the idea of starting our own business of selling vegetables. On 21st Nov 2019 during the monthly meeting I requested a loan of Rs. 6600 from my group and brought four wheel cart for carrying the vegetables while moving from place to place selling it.

From 28/11/2019 we started selling vegetables on daily basis and now we earn Rs. 300 to Rs. 500 daily as profit. Now our economic situation is better and we are able to manage our daily expense. I thank the animator Mrs. Rani and ACDSSS for all the trainings and skills and guidance given to me and helping me to be a business woman.

**Success Story**

My name is Anita Devi, resident of Achalpur, my family's financial condition was very poor. My husband had an accident with which he was unable to do any work. I was working as laborers in the others fields One day I went for the Self Help Group meeting and came to know about SHG formation from Program Manager Ms. Barnali and Mrs. Anita the Animator, and agreed to join the SHG group with the women present there. I started depositing Rs 100 every month and attend the meeting regularly where I learnt about the loan with an interest on 2% . I explained about the my financial situation and requested to the group to give a loan in urgent need. The members took the decision and gave me a loan of Rs.15000/- to start a petty shop. With that money I have started the shop and my husband is taking care of it. My daily income is Rs. 300 to 400/- I am repaying the loan in installments of Rs 1875/- with interest of 2 % every month and I will complete the repayment within 8 months . Now the financial condition of my home is much better than before. Now I can pay regular fees of my children and send them to school. I thank ACDSSS organization for the help and support received through Madam Barnali and the Animator Mrs.Anita . May they continue to guide and help the poor women like me.



## CASE STUDIES

### Case Study 1

Mrs. Suman Devi is from Gadimaharam village and a member of the Jayababa SHG functioning under ACDSSS. She has 3 children all are studying in government schools. Her husband works as daily laborer. But his income was not sufficient enough to meet the family needs. Mrs. Suman Devi attended the 3 months training on tailoring implemented by ACDSSS. Soon after the training she availed Rs 6000/- as loan from the SHG and bought a machine and started to stitch cloths and bags etc.

Now she is able to earn Rs.200/ per day and also repayed the loan on a monthly installment basis. Mrs. Suman Devi could bring additional income to the family as she got the opportunity to learn a viable trade. ACDSSS team's effort to gather the poor women into SHGs groups and supporting them through various training and skills development to be an independent women and increase her economic status.



### Case Study 2

The Savai village is one of the project target villages. The villagers were struggling due to the broken and pathetic condition of one of the main village roads especially during the monsoon season as it leads to water logging and spreads waterborne diseases. The Village Development Committee (Vikas Samiti) formed as part of the project by ACDSSS played a major role to make the road better. The committee members discussed during the meeting and decided to submit a petition to the Pradhan the village head and he took up the issue in the Gram Sabha meeting held in the village. The Gram Sabha decided to repair the road with the fund sanctioned from the Block Development Office. As a result the road was repaired with interlocking facilities with proper drains on both sides of the road. It is because of the proper functioning and active members of the Vikas Samiti with the support of ACDSSS team found the solution for common issue of the villagers.

## Success Story 1

I am Santosh D/o Ganga Prasad lives in Rawal. I have completed my higher secondary. My parents did not allow me go for further studies but told me to stay at home and involve in household work including farming. I was disappointed and cursed my fate for being a girl who was to get married and make another family. Since ours was a patriarchal society I had to accept my situation.



Mrs. Manju of Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Sanstha came to our village. She was friendly and open minded. She carried a lot of vigor and positive energy. She collected all the young girls from the village and began to interacting with them. She encouraged us to accept ourselves as we were. She became influential in the village. Slowly our parents and the leaders of the village began to trust and supported her work. She established 8 groups in our village consisted of 15 to 20 girls in each. I have become the leader of one of those groups due to her support and guidance.

Mrs. Manju conducted number of group sessions with us. Group sessions helped us to understand the ill effects of Child Marriage, deeper knowledge of our Body, importance of Food and Flag, usefulness of Kitchen Garden, provisions of RTI and Prevention of Domestic Violence Acts, importance of learning Self-defense, and gender equality. In order to boost our self-confidence she helped us to visit Bank, Mahila Thana, hospitals, Krishi Kendra and Post office and familiarized with the proceedings to access any service from them. We were able to develop group strength and give moral support by attaining programme in different villages and sharing our ideas with other girls.

We were provided livelihood training such as pickle making at ACDSSS office and we are now in business with pickle making. Changes in me changed my parents. They began to trust my abilities and allowed me to study further and work outside the village.

I took admission in Deenndayal Upadhyay Gramin Vikas Center for electricity course for 6 months. I worked in Best Cooking Company for 4 months where I was paid Rs 13,000/- per month. Later on I got an offer from an NGO called NIRFAD CBR worked for “differently abled”. I am paid an honorarium of Rs. 3,500/- per month. I am happy to work for the weaker section of the society.

I am grateful to Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Sanstha and Sakhi Project. SAKHI project changed my life.

## INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT FOR THE CHILDREN AND YOUNGSTERS WITH DISABILITIES, GANJDUNDWARA BLOCK, KASGANJ

Community based rehabilitation programmes designed in order to generate acceptance and compassion for individuals who are considered differently abled. ACDSSS takes initiatives to educate children with disabilities time to time. At present 40 Children with disabilities are under this programme. The organization has attempted its best to encourage individuals with disabilities acquire education and livelihood through forming groups like Disabled Person Organization (DPO). We indulge in activities to web the DPOs with government and other Aid agencies to access educational materials, health benefits such as surgery and therapy, aid implements and entitlements.

### Training/Events

Training on Rehabilitation, Education for PWD's parents, First Aids, Preparation of Organic Manure, Health, Income Generation, Physical and mental development, training for Health worker, Education for CWDs, Capacity Building, Physiotherapy, Recycle use of Waste Plastic- **Total 2795 People have benefitted from these training.**

Ms. Sifa, a 14 years old girl was affected with Polio on left leg, belongs to a poor family from Sultanpur village under the Kasganj District. Her father Mr. Shamshad and mother Mrs. Kaveena. Her father is a tailor who is a daily laborers. They are economically poor and depend upon the tailoring shop. They are illiterate, without proper knowledge and information regarding available medical treatment to cure the *Polio*, the parents did not take much care and she had to live with it. She faces many problems like gender discrimination, less freedom to move around in the villages.

Mr. Vijendra the CBR worker met her and registered her name in SLF project implemented by ACDSSS, Agra with the support of Jan Vikas Samiti. The project team educated the parents on the possibilities of treating the child's condition. The staff members linked them with the District Government Hospital, Kasganj to undergo free surgery to treat the Polio. As of now her leg is cured by the operation. She is very happy as she can move freely and live the life like anybody else, she wants to complete her education and stand on her own feet.

His father is a farmer. Ramsaran is very simple, hardworking and cheerful person. He is having a very good character. He mingles with everybody. The poor economic background of the parents prevented him from studies. He studied only up to 8<sup>th</sup> class. No support from family lack of confidence was not able to do any job, so he was discouraged and disheartened.

Mr.Vijendra the CBR worker met him and registered his name in project implemented by ACDSSS, Agra with the support of Jan Vikas Samiti. According to his interest he was given training on Mobile repairing and electronic goods. Mr.Vijendra the CBR workers continuous visit and moral support encouraged him to start a small shop, so with full confidence he started a small shop with pension which he received every quarterly Rs 2000/-. He collected money and bought some electronic things now his shop is running very well. He is earning Rs 4000/- every month .He is very happy and supporting his family. His parents are also very happy with him. He feels proud and thankful towards ACDSSS Staff.



So on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2019 women, adolescents girls and men went to meet BDO and submitted the application and explained the situation. Pradhan Mr. Chito Prasad explained everything to BDO Miss Tunlika Shrivastav. So the village secretary Mr. Avadesh Kumar called and told to start the work of drains, road and pavement. Through the help of SHO (Station Head officer), SDM (Sub Divisional Magistrate) and village Pradhan on 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2020 they decided to dig pond in the common place in same village. So on 4<sup>th</sup>

January they started the dig the pond. Very soon the work was completed with RCC construction and the water was collected in the pond. The people were very happy and grateful to the organization. Since many years seeing village condition no marriages were taking place. But now the condition of the village has improved people started to come to village and marriages started taking place. Thanks to the organization who showed the way.
