

He earns meager income and it is very difficult for me to run the family affairs on a daily basis. Moreover, I am disabled by leg and I feel I can't work like any other woman.



I was unaware of the government pension scheme for disabled people. I heard about disability pension from government during their community meetings of Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Sanstha. I approached the community health worker (CHW)



Ms.Laxmi from ACDSSS for Nagaria village and asked for help. Ms.Laxmi helped to file my disability pension application at Etah Tehsil very soon. Gladly I am grateful to ACDSSS received my pension of Rs.1000/- after three months.

PATH TO NEW LIFE

Unemployment was a norm in Negala Berawati village because people were unknown to MGNREGA. Path to new life is a lesson for those who willfully hide the privileges of the rightful and an inspiration for those who want to fight for their due rights.

It is the story of those people who remained in ignorance for so long and when knowledge surfaced they embraced and celebrated it to the fullest though they had to fight for it. When ACDSSS Project Staff performed street plays, conducted awareness camps, discussions and meetings on MGNREGA along the dusty roads and under the broken roofs, they were igniting and channeling the means for self actualization among ordinary people. Rojgar Sevak and Village Pradhan ignored villager's queries for job opportunities, Block Development Officer and Secretary of the Public Distribution System threatened them. Yet the courage of the people and the truth that people of N.Berawati village “knew” the privileges of the MGNREGA Act slew the arrogance of power and made it obliged to administer to the need of people. As a result of the pursuit 15 women were provided 20 days of work under the act by the Village Pradhan soon and 834 people were given employment during the year.



CASE STUDY - 2

Malnutrition diaboical ?

Silly but true for the poor and marginalized people of Nabipur Village of Mathura block U.P. Elders in the village commanded no recovery for malnourished children because it was considered diabolical. It took three years of concerted effort of the people concerned to reveal the hideous truth behind – gender based discrimination on food table! Younger children in the village are looked after by the elder siblings traditionally. Most of the time elder sisters gave away chunk of their food to the younger brothers and remained on little food. Nobody but ACDSSS dared to lift the diabolical curtain of this practice. Massive campaigns and free registration camps under Integrated Child Development Services brought 486 pregnant women, 347 lactating mothers 260 Adolescent Girls and 1853 children of 0-5 years to receive the benefits of AWCs in three years.

The community began to believe in the work of ACDSSS and confidently started sending their children to avail the free services of AWCs after witnessing the recovery of 7 malnourished children at the government hospital in fourteen days. Now 90 percent of the children in Nabipur village receive protein supplements and nutritional food from the village Anganwadi Centre and also the medical care from the government hospital.

EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME OF YOUNG MOTHERS AND ADOLESCENTS FOR FAMILY LIFE THROUGH HEALTH EDUCATION AND PRODUCTIVE SKILLS, GANJDUNDWARA BLOCK, KASGANJ

ACDSSS work with young mothers and adolescent girls envisioning a ominous future built on the family unit of society. Equity is one of our core values we diligently apply while working with vulnerable group such as women and adolescent girls. For the sake of family female members are often refused

nutrition, education and social acceptance. They end up with ill health, early marriage and social stigma of discrimination. ACDSSS gather such underprivileged young mothers and girls into groups and educate them on healthy practices for a bright future. Awareness campaigns and immunization drives are conducted to enlighten the women on various diseases. Superstitious beliefs are confronted with scientific education. Self Help Groups are formed to develop habits of saving as well as income generation. Our efforts to help women and adolescent girls to have healthy diet had resulted in planting nutrition garden in many houses of the intervention area.

Enlightening and Eliminating Child Labour from Carpet Industry Fatehabad & Samshabad Block, Agra

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

Child Labour, especially in the Carpet Industry is a huge problem claiming magnitudinal adverse impact in the lives of children in Agra District of Uttar Pradesh. The children are driven out of education and pressurized by their families to work in the looms. This is a menace in the 21st century where children are being prioritized as the most effective human tool for development of the Country and the Globe. The project has a set of objectives that has been set up for the eradication of Child Labour with additional follow up of their conditions. Various activities and strategies are applied in context of the project's aims and objectives so that there would be a significant reduction in the number of children working in the Carpet Industry. For better implementation of the project, an all-inclusive method has been worked out in the intervention area which included the family, the teachers and the children themselves.

SUCCESS STORY

“The only disability in life is a bad attitude”

This is the story of the disabled children who were living in the villages under the project intervention area. They were helpless as before the intervention of ACDSSS, no one was there to take stock of their situation. So, they were quite helpless as they could not carry on with their daily activities like normal people. In fact, their disability started acting as a barrier for them in order to live their lives. The Project Staff decided to take stock of the situation after looking at their problems. The field Animators conducted a survey in all the villages of the project area and list of the disabled persons was made. So, on 21-08-2018, they got registered under the Zila Parishad of Fatehabad. A receipt was issued after their registration which informed the Persons with Disabilities by the Animators to be present at Govt. Degree College, Fatehabad on 19-09-2018. On the very date, the disabled persons received Tricycles, Calipers and Clutches through the help of the Project Staff. All of them were very happy after having received the materials provided to them. They were very thankful to ACDSSS and the Project Staff for their kindness and availability for them.



Village Savai falls under Etmadpur Block Agra. Safe drinking water was scarce in the village. The only source of water was the bore well at the entrance of the village. But the submersible pump was damaged and useless and therefore women walked a mile to fetch potable water every day. ACDSSS had initiated a women's group in the village called “the Mahila Mandal”. The Mandal spoke to the village Pradhan about their plight several times but she behaved indifferently. The mahila mandal called for a meeting on 20-6-2018 and wrote an application to the Pradhan demanding a solution to the crisis. Mrs. Manjula, the village Pradhan alarmed by the public pressure promised repair of the submersible pump and a new bore well with a hand pump to the women. On 26-7-2018 the boring of the new well started and everyone shouted in joy seeing water gushing down out in the well. A new hand pump was fixed to the pipes inserted to lift water for the public and they are grateful for the moment.

In the village Gadi Maharam loom industry provided daily wage income to people like Jayakumar, a 12 year old boy from the same village for years. On finding Jayakumar in the factory instead of at school the Animator of the project discussed the issue with Bal Committee members, loom agent, the boy and his parents. The animator explained the importance of education to his parents during the conversation. As a result of frequent visits and motivation the parents realized that they could change the life of Jaya Kumar and so stopped him from going to the loom. Jayakumar's parents took the help of the animator and enrolled his name in the school. Now JayaKumar is studying in the 6th standard with lots of dreams for his future.



“When you change the way you look at things the things you look at change”

In 2012 ACDSSS intervention began in Mittawalli village which is in Etmadpur block at Agra district through the child labour project and slowly people of Mittawalli village were taken in to confidence .The village road was broken near the school for 8 months and villagers were suffering a lot and especially during monsoon the entire area used to become water logged. Because of the water logging there were many other problem like sanitation, water borne diseases, transport so many other problems. In this village there is a Vikas samiti formed by the ACDSSS in the year 2013 under child labour project .The Vikas samiti organized meeting on 16-4-2018 in which 20 members were present. They decided to meet Mr. Munishvaran the pradhan of the village. On 17-4-2018 they wrote application signed by all and submitted it to the pradhan . There was no action from the part of the pradhan 24-4-2018 in the village Mittawalli we had Gram sabha meeting along with the animator and the SHG members and Vikas samiti members again they gave the application. The pradhan and the Block development officer promised them that he would immediately look in to the matter.8-6-2018 they started to making the road. 2400 mt. interlocking road and drainage was repaired. The SHG members and the Vikas samiti members have become so much empowered and they are able to take up the development work of village and they feel happy for taking responsibility in constructing the road.

CASE STUDY

SUKHDEVPUR VILLAGE

I am Khushboo from Sukhdevpur village of Mathura District. My father's name is Brijlal and my mother's Nargis. I have six sisters and one brother. My father has a small shop. My mother is a housewife. Sakhi Project from Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Sanstha ran a tailoring Centre in 2017 in our village. We the three sisters- Sanjna, Priyanka and I learnt to stitch petticoat, baby frock, salvar suit, blouse from that tailoring centre. Soon my father brought us a stitching contract from "Kishna's cloth", a wholesale vendor of the region. We three sisters stitch for the Krishna's and earn Rs. 10,000/- monthly. Our family's economy has improved and we are happy to save some money with the Syndicat Bank. My family and I are grateful to Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Santha for the training given to us and the other girls of my village so that we have become more confident in life. Today we all sisters are studying as well as earning. Sakhi Project helped us understanding the ill effects of child marriage also and stopped child marriage in my family which was traditionally practiced. We thank ACDSSS for all that they do for the empowerment of Adolescent girls in villages.



CASE STUDY

RAWAL VILLAGE

My name is Neeru Chauhan. I am a member of Radha Rani Group. I have three sisters and one brother. My father works as a daily labourer. My elder brother got married and stays separately. I completed my Bachelor of Arts. While I was doing B.A Mrs. Manjus, an Animator of Sakhi Project came to my village to work with Adolescent girls. She constantly made us aware to go out for further studies and not to get frightened of challenges in the way. She motivated me to join Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhy Gramin Kaushal Yojna at Raya and helped me to get my admission. I chose Domestic Electrician course and completed in six months. I am glad to share that at present I am working in Best Cooki Company at Goudgan for Mahindra & Mahindra. I am earning Rs. 13000/- per month. My family trusted me and sent me to work outside the village. Sakhi Project helped girls like me of my village to gain knowledge in different topics and become confident to move out alone. I became aware that there are many girls who move out of the village and work like me. I am thankful to Agra Catholic Diocese Samaj Seva Sanstha for empowering me to stand on my own feet and help my family economically.

CASE STUDY - 1

WATER IS LIFE

Nagla Nayanpur village of Mathura District of U.P. was hard hit by lack of drinking water. Women in the village were forced on foot about 2.5 K.M on average to fetch water for their family everyday or buy water at the rate of Rs.1 per litre. An experiment conducted on the request of village Pradhan Mr. Charan Singh said local water bodies contained 2600ppm Total Dissolved Solids (T.D.S) on average which is five fold of the safe yet dangerous level of T.D.S in drinking water. People suffered from joint pain, indigestion, jaundice, headache and kidney disfunction. Agriculture became almost impossible. Life seemed to be a hell.

ACDSSS Project Staff came to know about the situation and set out to help the villagers. They assisted the people to develop a micro plan to establish a Reverse Osmosis(R.O) water treatment

plant in the village. Village Pradhan Mr.charan Singh, very much conerned by the issue took the request of his people to Peeramal Samaj Society of Rajastan. PSS held a consultation with the people of Nagla Nayanpur village and finally reached a conclusion to build an R.O plant with people's participation. Plant construction was completed and opened for public in July 2018. Now people collect water from the plant at the rate of 30 paise per liter



CASE STUDY - 2

RADIANCE OF HOPE

Indresh Rani of Nagla Sumaira village of Matura District wanted to save her little income from her husband but did not know the way. Sooner she became the member of Jaishree Self Help Group formed by ACDSSS staff in the village. In the beginning she was reluctant and doubtful because she found her group members hesitant to trust and accept each other. However constant house visits and regular monthly meeting conducted the project staff helped her understand the functioning of SHGs and take her friends in the group into confidence.

Indresh rani discussed with the group members and borrowed Rs.5000/- to start a small grocery shop in front of her house. Now, she earns Rs.500 to 800 profit a day and has become a model for the women in her village.



CASE STUDY - 3

CHANGING WAYS

Mr. Ramesh Chandra lived in Nagla Nayaranpur village of Mathura District U.P. He earned for his livelihood from farming in the 3 bigha land he held. He cultivated vegetables and cereals. He believed pesticides would bring bumper crops and used variety of pesticides for crop protection and better yielding. He was awe struck by the knowledge that chemical pesticides destroy health causing deadly diseases like cancer from the community meetings of ACDSSS on organic farming. On deciding to change

his ways Ramesh underwent training to learn the methods to prepare bio-pesticides and insecticides. He began to produce chemical free vegetables using organic fertilizers soon under the guidance of SAKSHAM project.

Ramesh now follows integrated pest management system taught in the demonstration training of the project. He encourages other farmers to test their soil regularly for better production and climate adaptation.

FIRST CONTACT WITH OUR ORGANIZATION

Ms. Rita was affected with polio in her right leg and is being supported under the SLF project since 2011.

PROBLEM FACED

In order to convince the parents for child's education the Organizational Staff faced lots of struggles. Constant family visit and counseling sessions by the staff helped the parents to change their attitude towards the education of the child. It was difficult for the CBR workers to convince the parents for the surgery.

ASSISTANCE PROVIDED & RESULTS

The poor socio economic condition of the family coupled with the ill health condition of the stepmother always pulled the family back to go on with the decision to make her undergo surgery to treat her leg. Through the support of the SLF project she could make it a reality and now she is able to walk independently. Currently she is supported to continue her education through the Education Aid programme under ACDSSS. She goes to school every day and is with more enthusiasm to do well in her studies.

PROBLEM FACED

Manoj Kumar suffered from locked knee making him less able to walk, step up, or even sit down comfortably.

ASSISTANCE PROVIDED & RESULTS

The CBR workers motivated the parents on the possibility of treating the locked knee through a surgery and subsequently linked them with the **Dean Dayal Upadhaya Hospital at Aligarh**. He underwent surgery in March 2018 and after the surgery he is able to bend his knee, walk straight and independently. The support of ACDSSS is being continued to him through its Education Aid Programme.

Testimony - 1

Mrs Radha, Shyamo Village

"I am Mrs. Radha Devi from Shyamo village. I run a tailoring shop in the village. And I struggled a lot to manage the house with the income I was making from it. I heard about Self Help Groups and its benefits from Mrs. Madhu the animator of ACDSSS. I joined in Jeevan Jyoti Self Help Group and availed an amount of Rs 50000/- as loan on 26th July 2018. I put up a beauty parlour with space available for selling sarees (Indian women's traditional wear). From beauty parlour is I am getting Rs.450/- on average per day. It helps a lot to run my family well. Big thanks to ACDSSS for standing by people like me."



Testimony - 2

Mrs. Gunjan, Pachgai village

"I am Mrs. Gunjan, from Pachgai village. My husband works on daily wage. We live an insufficient life with his meager income. In 2015 I joined the Satya Self Help Group formed by ACDSSS and started saving Rs. 100 per month. Receiving Rs 15000/- as loan from the group on 15th July 2018, I purchased a tailoring machine and began to stitch blouses and petticoats and sold them in the neighbourhood. Now I am able to earn around Rs. 2500 monthly and contribute to family. I am so happy that I could refund the loan on time and I am extremely grateful to ACDSSS"



CASE STUDY 4 (Strengths Of Group Efforts)

Iswardevi SHG Nobri Village

The members of Iswardevi Self Help Group made a remarkable intervention to build peace in their village. Nobri village has witnessed number of quarrels and fights among its members over drinking water sharing as there was only one hand pump available for the entire village. The women of Iswardevi Self Help Group discussed the matter in the group and also with the ACDSSS project team. They met the Village Pradhan (head of the village) on 5th July 2018 and presented the issue and asked him to help them with a common bore well in the village. Following the directives of the Pradhan along with ACDSSS team the women group submitted an application to the Village Development Committee on 11th September 2018. On 22nd Jan 2019 four months after the submission the village Development Committee sanctioned the request. The bore well was installed soon and peace restored in the village through this group effort.

Every month action plan has been prepared by the Programme Manager, Coordinator and Animators and sent it to the head office. All the field activities and planned in consultation with the Director. Every month field Coordinator bring qualitative and quantitative reports along with them and discuss field related issues and problems with the Director and the programme staff make the strategy for the future plan of action.

QUARTERLY, HALF YEARLY AND ANNUAL MEETING

Four quarterly meetings were held during this year on i.e. 3rd & 4th July 2018, 2nd & 3rd Oct. 2018, 2nd & 3rd Jan. 2019 and 30th & 31st March 2019. During these meetings the presentation of each project is done. Director, Programme Manager & Coordinators provide suggestions to the field staff. Thus the field staff is facilitated to take up the responsibilities for effective functioning.



AGRA RAINBOW PROGRAMME : ACDSSS in collaboration with Archdiocesan Board of Education organized an Archdiocesan Cultural Fiesta 2018 in Agra, on November 23rd 2018.

Most Rev. Dr. Albert D'Souza, the Archbishop of Agra was the President. The Chief Guest was Mr. Anil Kumar Deputy Commissioner of Agra, The main aim of the program is make the students and teachers aware of the noble work that is being done by our Catholic organization through various apostolates.



To enhance their self esteem and to foster respect for our institutional culture, commitment, competence, coordination and contribution. To convince the faculty, parents and students about the need of co-operation, team work, open mindedness for personal and social transformation and development.

Various programs like Group dance, Group song, Painting, Tableau, Instrumental music were held.

A total of 1200 students from 26 School actively

participated and won many prizes. The children were very happy as they were able to build the up inter-school relationship and experience the unity among the institutions with value based education for social transformation and development.

TRAINING ON ORGANIC FARMING & MANURE PREPARATION 2 days training on Agriculture

and Organic farming for farmers in Saksham project was held on 26th 27th May 2018. Dr. Haridas from Caritas India was the resource person. Fr. Anthony Director, UKSVK, Fr. Jacob Principal of Jait School were present. Dr. Haridas explained about the importance of water, then told them to save rain water by making big pits in the field so that the rain water can be filled and be soaked in the ground. He also told them not to use fertilizers which will destroy the immunity of the ground, but instead use the waste that is decomposed like vermin composts, rose petal water, pipe composts which can be used to purify the water. He also explained the harm that is taking place when fertilizers are used how the health of the people is affected as we consume the food that is grown inorganic. Around 55 women from the project areas along with 30 staff from the near by project area have attended this program.


